## Show Awards

- A trophy will be awarded to the individual competitor that receives the highest number of points in each section.
- A separate trophy will be awarded to the competitor that receives the highest number of points across the whole Show.

Each section winner will be awarded an old Lister trophy. The winner of the vegetable section will be awarded the Dave Butterfield Cup. Winners may have their photo taken with the trophy as a memento, but due to their historical value, they will not be available to take away from the Chantry Centre.

## Section 1: Vegetables & Fruits Open to all ages

- 101 3 Carrots
- 102 3 Round beetroot
- 103 2 Courgettes
- 104 3 Onions
- 105 5 Potatoes of the same variety
- 106 Longest runner bean
- 107 6 French beans
- 108 6 Runner beans
- 109 6 Cherry Tomatoes
- 110 6 Tomatoes of the same type – salad, beefsteak or plum
- 111 2 Cucumbers
- 112 Collection of pumpkins, gourds or squashes
- 113 Collection of vegetables arranged on a plate, 6 kinds, 2 of each kind. May include edible flowers and herbs.
- 114 Comically shaped fruit or veg
- 115 4 Cooking apples
- 116 4 Eating apples
- 117 6 Plums, gages or damsons
- 118 6 of any other fruit not mentioned above



## Section 2: Flowers Open to all ages

## Section 3: Baking Open to all ages


- 301 A cake made with a vegetable
- 302 A vegan cake or sweet tart
- 303 A Victoria Sponge (made with 3 eggs)
- 304 A lemon drizzle cake
- 305 6 pieces of Brownie or Blondie
- 306 6 Biscuits of the same type
- 307 A round of shortbread
- 308 4 Cheese scones
- 309 A savoury flan
- 310 A sourdough loaf – handmade, any flour
- 311 3 bread rolls – handmade, any flour



## Section 4: Preserves and Home Produce Open to all ages

- 401 A pot of mixed fruit jam
  - 402 A pot of single fruit jam

  - 406 A jar of pickle or relish
  - 407 A bottle of homemade cordial or squash

## Section 5: Homemade Beer and Wine Open to over 18s only

## Section 6: Crafts Open to all ages

- 601 A soft toy – can be made using any techniques
- 602 A knitted or crocheted garment
- 603 A sewn item of clothing (includes hats & bags)
- 604 A household item made using any technique (cushions, tea cosies etc)
- 605 An embroidered or cross stitch item
- 606 A tapestry or woven item
- 607 “The Transformation Challenge” – a household or clothing item made from something repurposed

## Section 7: Children’s Classes For under 17s, except where specified



- 701 1 decorated biscuit – 10 years and under
- 702 Make a bug house from any materials – 10 years and under
- 703 Picture of an animal / your pet – 10 years and under
- 704 Make a monster / animal from fruit and / or veg
- 705 A garden on a plate – 10 years and under
- 706 Tallest sunflower. We will come and measure!  
Free plants available from April, collect from table at 4 Fort Lane



## Show Rules

1. The Cam and Dursley Flower & Produce Show is open to everyone. There are no restrictions.
2. The entry fee is 20p per exhibit for adults (17 and over) and 10p per exhibit for children.
3. No exhibitor can show more than one entry in each class.
4. Children's ages on the day of the show must be stated on their entry forms and all exhibitor's cards.
5. Entry forms are to be posted or delivered by hand to the Chantry Centre.
6. Entry fees should be paid on the day of the show when exhibits are delivered to the Chantry Centre.
7. All exhibits must be the result of unaided work by the exhibitor.
8. All exhibits to be displayed at the Chantry Centre, Long Street, Dursley by 9.00am on the day of the Show.
9. Exhibitors must provide their own vases for display of exhibits.
10. Root vegetable tops must have foliage trimmed back to approx. 8cm. Onions must have roots trimmed, tops tied down and loose skin removed. Tomatoes must be displayed with calyces. Peas and beans must be displayed with some stalk attached. Apples should be displayed with stalk but no leaves attached.
11. Points will be awarded in all classes. 3 for first, 2 for second, 1 for third.
12. The judge's decision will be final.
13. Exhibits should have a title where possible, for the interest of visitors.
14. Cam and Dursley Flower and Produce Show and the Chantry Centre cannot be held responsible for any show exhibit that is lost, stolen or damaged.



## Things for Competitors to Remember

Deliver or post your entry form to arrive at The Chantry Centre by 6.00pm on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> August 2022.

Bring your competition entries to:

- The Chantry Centre, 34-36 Long Street, Dursley, GL11 4JB between 8.00am and 9.30am on Saturday 27 August 2022 (the morning of the Show).
- Judging will take place 10.00 - 11.00am. Everyone will be asked to vacate the hall while this takes place.
- The Show will open to the public at 11.30am with free admission for everyone.
- Trophies will be awarded at 12.00 noon.
- Your entries can be collected from the hall after 2.00pm.
